



### F1 2026 Event Insurance Cover Checklist

Please confirm that the insurance policies you (**Promoter**) are contractually required to purchase for your round of the 2026 FIA FORMULA ONE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP (**Event**) (**Event Policy**) provide comprehensive insurance cover including, but not limited to, the key points below. The contents of this checklist are not an exhaustive list of the cover required. Please refer to your Promoter Contract and local laws to ensure all requirements have been met. ### Aviation

Please provide details of any proposed aviation activities for the Event. Aviation activities are deemed to be ANYTHING that is “off the ground” and include, but are not limited to, aerial/aerobatics displays, aerial filming, flypasts (military or otherwise), air ambulance, medivac, use of drones (if permitted by FOWC), pleasure rides, aircraft shuttle service in and out of circuit, personal aircraft (fixed wing or rotor wing), flying in and out of circuit or other official venues (subject to the relevant permits being obtained), parachutists, skydivers, rocket-man, fly-boards or similar.

Any aviation activity must be covered under a separate aviation insurance policy. Due to the varying risk of different aviation activities, once the exposure is known, you will be advised of the required limit of liability and policy terms. However, as a guide, any aviation insurance policy must include at a minimum the following:

- (i) insurance cover on an indemnity basis for all the Insured Parties (sections 2 - 19 (inclusive));
- (ii) a minimum limit of liability on an each and every occurrence basis of:
  - A. USD10,000,000 for a flying man, drone or similar activity; and
  - B. USD25,000,000 for fly-pasts;
- (iii) a waiver of subrogation against the Insured Parties; and
- (iv) a cross-liability clause.

**Please note that all aviation activities relating to the Event are subject to the prior approval of the FIA and F1.**

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## APPENDIX

### DEFINITIONS/EXPLANATIONS/EXAMPLE POLICY WORDING

#### DEFINITIONS/EXPLANATIONS

1. **Active Assailant Liability (section 1(a)(ii)):** attack carried out by an individual with the intent of killing or causing harm to a person or people, where the motive is not necessarily of an ideological, political, or religious nature and would not be covered by terrorism liability.
2. **Terrorism Liability (section 1(a)(iii)):** arising out of an occurrence, for bodily injury and/or property damage resulting solely and directly from an act or acts of terrorism.
3. **Worldwide jurisdiction in respect of third-party claims (section 45):** the Event Policy may be subject to local law and jurisdiction for general purposes, in line with local regulatory requirements. However, it is essential that the policy provides worldwide jurisdiction, specifically in respect of third-party claims, to ensure coverage applies regardless of where a claim is brought or where the claimant is based. This reflects the international nature of the Event, its participants, and attendees.

#### EXAMPLE POLICY WORDING

4. **Event definition (section 1(c)):** *"Formula 1 XXXX Grand Prix 2026, including any activity which takes place (on or off track) at the circuit during the Access Period and any activity which takes place in any location (including outside the circuit) in connection with the Event during the Access Period, including in each case all set-up and dismantling."*
5. **Waiver of subrogation clause (section 42):** *"Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, it is understood and agreed that this policy contains a waiver of subrogation against each additional insured party."*
6. **Cross-liability clause (section 43):** *"Each person or party indemnified by this policy is separately indemnified in respect of claims made against any of them by any other person or party indemnified by this policy, subject to Underwriters' total liability not exceeding the sums stated in the Limits of Indemnity."*
